Every Life Shall Be a Song

for SATB Chorus and Orchestra

Every Life Shall Be a Song is a celebration of life, unity, and music — a setting of a poem by the 19th century British author John Addington Symonds (1840–1893). The text speaks of the future with hope. “A loftier race than e'er the world has known shall rise.” The healing and transforming power of music is essential to this hope. “When every life shall be a song, then all the earth is a paradise.”

The musical expression alternates between added-tone chords (*building* for the future) and melodic phrases (for the more tender passages in the poem – “we will be gentle, brave and strong”). Throughout, the message is triumphant. “These things shall be!”
