The Mark of Zorro

for Wind Quintet

Listener's Guide to "The Mark of Zorro"

[which may be read aloud to the audience before the start of this movement]

For those listeners who are familiar with the legend of Zorro, one will recall that he always carves his trademark "Z" (three slashes of the sword) on the wall (or his victim!) when he leaves. [Reader demonstrates this gesture/sound.] Therefore, this music opens and closes with various three-slash patterns.

Then, at a fast tempo, the energy is gathered for a sword duel. Many slashes of grace notes are heard.

In the heat of the duel, Zorro's mind switches suddenly to gentle thoughts of his beloved. A flowing melody in the Oboe signifies romance.

The duel then resumes, with more sword play leading to a final, triumphant "Z" slashed in the air. [Reader demonstrates another Z pattern.]
