The Great Lakes Overture

a nautical adventure for chamber orchestra

setting forth...on the water...early in the morning

Total duration: 3 minutes

This overture is the preface to the **The Great Lakes** cantata, a 7-movement work for chorus and chamber orchestra. The intent of this introduction is to provide *nautical* imagery to bring the listener into the watery world of the Great Lakes.

The start of the journey is marked by the ringing of a ship's bell, tolling the hours of the embarkation (or of the beginning of the orchestra concert!). Soon, the listener might hear (envision) the rising of the mist on the lake. Then comes a *jaunty* Piccolo/fife theme, with the spirit of "setting forth."

A calmer middle section arrives with triple meter and a gentle Oboe theme "on the water." Strings provide a *shimmering waves* accompaniment.

Energy gathers for a lively closing section based on the sea chanty "What Shall We Do with the Drunken Sailor...so early in the morning?" The phrase of these lyrics, "Way, way up she rises," joyously comes to life in the Temple Blocks. A quick ending follows: "so early in the morning!" And then the ship's bell returns, marking the hours.
